<p>Introduction: Who are you? Why are you writing? What would you like?</p>

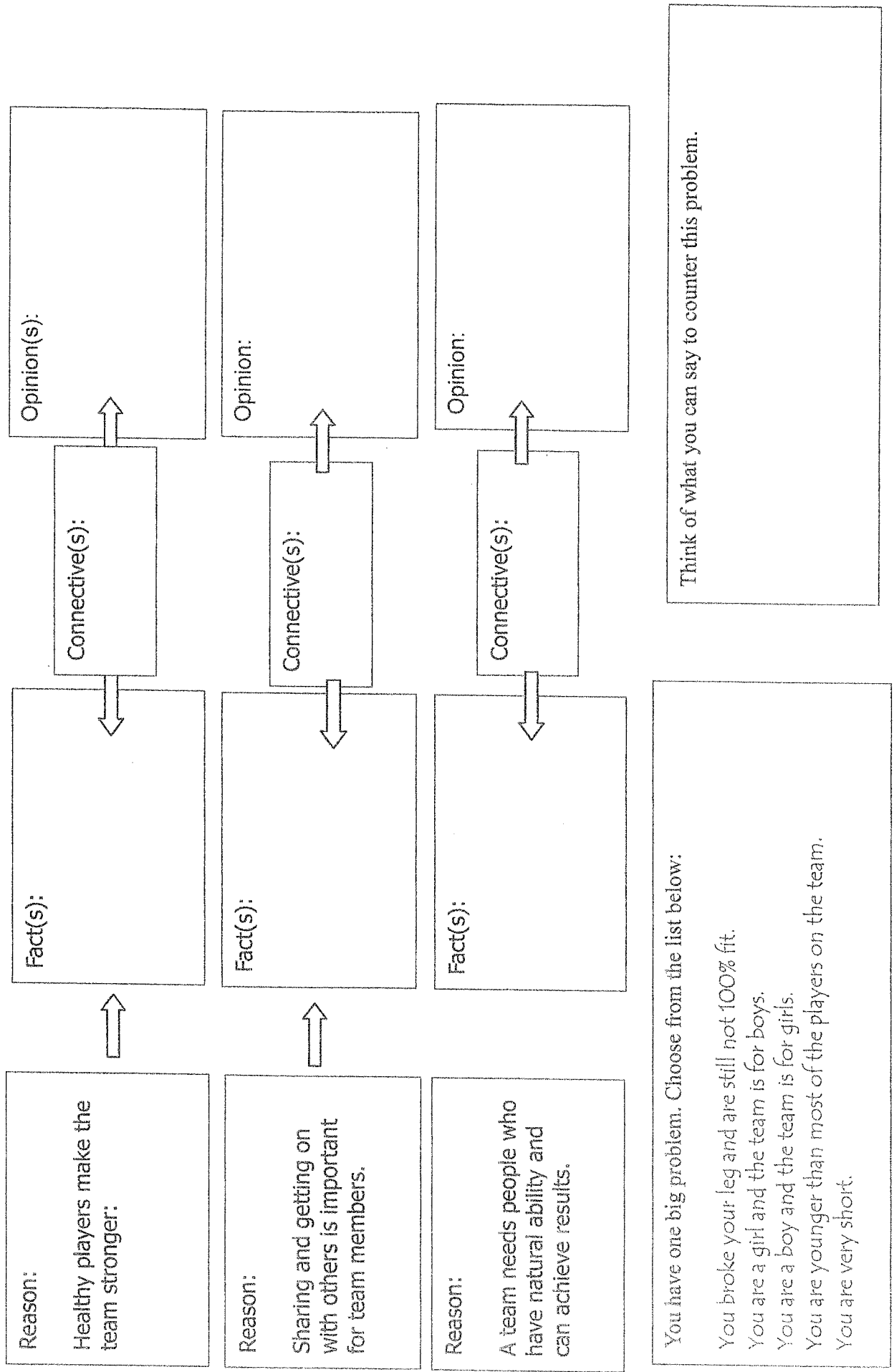
The first one is done for you. You can use this idea or change it. Think about exercise you do, your eating/sleeping habits, friends, goals/medals you have won...
